

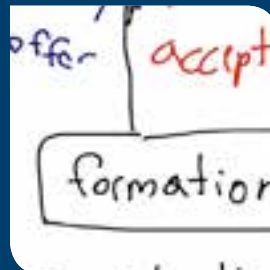
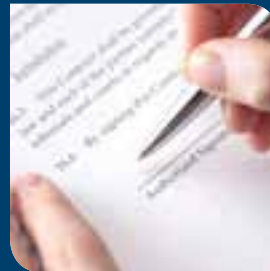

- be able to demonstrate difficulties and/or disadvantage
- be starting a full-time degree program at IBIBS in 2017
- be relocating from a regional or remote area to study in Melbourne having:
 - lived in a regional or remote area for at least three of the four years before commencing your program, or
 - completed your final two years of secondary school in a regional or remote school in the four years before, or
 - completed your secondary schooling in a major city but maintained your regional or remote home address in the four years before

- be a female citizen of Australia or an Australian permanent resident
- have achieved above average Year 12 results in 2016 or in a previous year
- be starting a full-time degree program at IBIBS in 2017
- not already be enrolled at IBIBS
- demonstrate your academic potential/merit
- not previously have been enrolled in tertiary education.

NON-YEAR 12 SCHOLARSHIP

If you have not previously completed year 12 studies this scholarship is available for applicants that show initiative and enterprise experience.

If you can demonstrate entrepreneurial endeavours and financial and/or educational disadvantage, then this scholarship awards you \$28,000 per year (upto \$84,000 over 3 years) against your IBIBS tuition fees for the total duration of your course.

To be eligible you must:

- be a citizen of Australia or an Australian permanent resident
- passed at least Year 10
- be starting a full-time degree program at IBIBS in 2017
- not already be enrolled at IBIBS
- demonstrate your academic potential/merit
- not previously have been enrolled in tertiary education.

STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

These scholarships are based on your academic excellence in Year 12 and the State that you reside in.

This scholarship awards you \$28,000 per year (upto \$84,000 over 3 years) against your IBIBS tuition fees for the total duration of your course.

To be eligible you must:

- be a citizen of Australia or an Australian permanent resident that resides in Victoria, NSW, Queensland, South Australia or Western Australia for the last 2 years
- achieve above average Year 12 results in 2016 or in a previous year
- be able to demonstrate financial difficulties and/or educational disadvantage
- be starting a full-time degree program at IBIBS in 2017
- not already be enrolled at IBIBS
- show initiative in your academic or personal life

COURSEWORK SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DOMESTIC STUDENTS – TERMS & CONDITIONS

1. INTRODUCTION

This document outlines the Terms and Conditions for all scholarships, bursaries and awards for students on Australian campuses, administered by IBIBS. All scholarships, bursaries and awards will be referred to as ‘scholarships’ herein. Students in receipt of an industry or course based scholarship (eg Private Equity, Venture Capital Industry-Based Learning Entry Scholarship), may also be required to sign an individual scholarship agreement.

Students must meet all conditions as outlined in the agreement. You must read these Terms and Conditions in their entirety before you accept your scholarship offer. When you accept your scholarship you are agreeing to and accepting the Terms and Conditions and agree to the requirements and conditions of your scholarship.

The following scholarships are available to domestic¹ students commencing at IBIBS in 2017.

- Full² Scholarships (3 years) & Partial Scholarships (1 year)
- Merit
- Equity
- Women
- Industry
- Regional & States
- Michael Adermann Scholarship³

1.1 IBIBS COURSEWORK SCHOLARSHIPS UNIT (CSU)

The IBIBS CSU is responsible for:

- making all coursework scholarship offers
- processing all coursework scholarship payments
- maintaining all records relating to coursework scholarships
- reviewing the academic progress and eligibility of scholarship holders.

1.2 KEEPING YOUR CONTACT DETAILS UP TO DATE

All hardcopy correspondence during the application process will be sent to the address submitted in your scholarship application. Current IBIBS students must update their address details in IBIBS Student Portal. Prospective students must inform the CSU of any change in name or address details by submitting the information online.

All current students are issued with an IBIBS email account. This is the main way the CSU will communicate with you. It is essential that you check your IBIBS email account regularly.

¹ You are a domestic student if you are: An Australian citizen; An Australian permanent resident (including Australian permanent humanitarian visa holders); A New Zealand citizen.
² These scholarships meet the full cost of tuition fees only and are payable for up to three years of the course for which you hold the scholarship provided that you remain enrolled as a full-time student.
³ This IBIBS Scholarship for very high-achieving students that achieve an (ATAR Ranking / Enter Score above 90% or equivalent)

2. ACCEPTING YOUR SCHOLARSHIP

2.1 SCHOLARSHIP OFFER PACKAGE

You will receive an offer package containing:

- Letter of Offer
- Acceptance/Decline form
- How to Enrol Information Sheet, and
- Terms and Conditions Booklet (this document)

Your scholarship offer letter outlines how to accept, reject, or for select scholarships, defer your scholarship via the IBIBS Student Portal System (ISPS).

If you do not respond to your scholarship offer by the date specified on your scholarship offer letter, your scholarship offer may lapse or be withdrawn and your scholarship may be allocated to another eligible student.

To accept your scholarship, return the Acceptance form and bank details form to the IBIBS CSU Office by the date specified in your letter of offer. Completion of the Recipient Survey is voluntary. You may apply to defer your scholarships for up to one year on the condition that your faculty allows you to defer your course place.

2.2 COMMENCEMENT

All scholarships are awarded on the basis that you will commence study in the course and in the semester specified in your letter of offer.

2.3 FULL-TIME STUDY

All scholarships are awarded on the basis that you will maintain a full-time enrolment. The normal workload for each year of a course is 4 units of study per semester. If you are enrolled in more than one course and are unable to remain enrolled full-time in your sponsored course due to extenuating circumstances, you must seek approval from your CSU Manager to retain your scholarship. You may be permitted to hold other awards which enhance your studies at IBIBS provided that you obtain written approval from the Manager.

3. SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENTS

3.1 SCHOLARSHIP VALUE AND PAYMENTS

The value of your scholarship is outlined in your offer letter. For scholarships paid 'per 12.5 credit points', the total scholarship value is based on the minimum number of credit points required to complete your degree at the time you receive your first scholarship payment. This does not include advanced standing. Your scholarship will be terminated once you have been paid the total scholarship value.

3.2 PAYMENTS DATES

Scholarship shall be offset against IBIBS tuition fees at the commencement of each semester, once all required documentation has been received. If applicable, alternate payment times will be outlined in your offer letter. You must accept your scholarship offer by the due date, as instructed in your offer letter, to be eligible to receive the scholarship award.

You will be sent an email with instructions on how to enter or update your bank account details in IBIBS Student Portal. If you do not provide the CSU with these details by the required date, your scholarship may be terminated.

3.3 HOW IS YOUR SCHOLARSHIP PAYMENT CALCULATED?

3.3.1 CREDIT POINT CALCULATION

Your scholarship payments will be calculated according to the number of credit points you are enrolled in at the census dates.

Semester one: for units of study with a census date - Thursday 31 March.

Semester two: for units of study with a census date - Monday 7 August.

You will not be paid for units that are studied at another Higher education institution or that do not form part of your degree. If you are enrolled in two degrees concurrently, you will only receive payment for study in the degree the scholarship was awarded for.

3.4 HOW YOUR SCHOLARSHIP IS PAID

All Scholarships awarded shall be paid by offsetting the Scholarship amount against IBIBS tuition fees.

If you have an encumbrance or fine against you at the census date, you will not be paid the scholarship until the encumbrance or fine is removed.

4. SCHOLARSHIP CONDITIONS

4.1 SPECIFIC CRITERIA

IBIBS Scholarships are awarded based on established eligibility criteria. You must meet the eligibility requirements to receive your scholarship payment(s). The eligibility requirements for each scholarship are outlined on the website: www.ibibs.edu.au/scholarships.

You will be re-assessed for eligibility prior to each payment. If you do not meet the eligibility criteria or scholarship conditions at this time, your scholarship may be terminated. Students in receipt of a donor-funded scholarship (e.g. the Michael Adermann Scholarship), may be required to provide a report to the donor. Other information relevant to your scholarship application or enrolment may also be passed onto the scholarship donor.

All scholarships are awarded on the basis that you will maintain an “enrolled, full-time” status in your course of study. Your scholarship may be terminated if your enrolment status is ‘inactive’ at census date.

4.2 SCHOLARSHIP DURATION

Most scholarships are payable for the minimum number of credit points required to complete the degree you are enrolled in at the time you receive your first scholarship payment. Your scholarship will not be paid for any additional credit points or advance standing. All other scholarships will be paid for the duration stated in your scholarship offer letter.

4.3 DEFERRING YOUR SCHOLARSHIP

If you are awarded a scholarship you can defer only under exceptional circumstances for a maximum period of 12 months. You must apply for deferment in writing to CSU Manager for approval that remains in the Manager’s sole discretion.

If your scholarship cannot be deferred, you are not permitted to intermit the scholarship in the first semester it is awarded. You will not receive scholarship payments whilst you are on intermission. When you recommence your studies, your scholarship payments will resume according to the Terms and Conditions set out herein.

Students receiving a partial or 1 year scholarship cannot defer or intermit their scholarship. Under no circumstances can an IBIBS Scholarship be transferred to another course.

4.4 DISCONTINUING YOUR COURSE

If you discontinue your course, your scholarship will be terminated. Upon any return to IBIBS, you are required to reapply for scholarships and there is no guarantee that you will be reoffered the same scholarship.

If you are unsure how changes to your enrolment will affect your scholarship, you should submit an enquiry online at scholarship@ibibs.edu.au

5. RETENTION OF SCHOLARSHIP

5.1 RETAINING YOUR SCHOLARSHIP

To retain your scholarship, you must:

- maintain your residency status and advise the IBIBS CSU within 14 days if you change your residency status
- provide confirmation of your circumstances during the term of the scholarship as requested
- maintain full-time enrolment in an approved course at IBIBS
- adhere to IBIBS's academic and administrative policies; and
- meet any additional criteria as outlined in your offer letter and listed under individual scholarship entries on the IBIBS coursework scholarships website.

5.2 ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

Students who are in receipt of a scholarship (full or partial) for one year may have their scholarship terminated after the first semester if they fail to meet the required academic performance. If your performance falls below the required Weighted Average Mark (WAM)⁴ of your student cohort, the procedures detailed below will be followed:

5.3 UNDERPERFORMING STUDENTS PROCEDURE

The procedure for academic progress for scholarship students will be undertaken each semester, as follows after the release of results.

1. Unless students were granted special consideration or if other extenuating circumstances apply and are recognised by IBIBS; and you obtained approval from the CSU Manager, no action will be taken and you will receive your scholarship payments as normal, otherwise you will be notified in writing by the CSU manager that your performance is under review and that you are on probation. You will be paid whilst you are on probation.
2. If you meet the required minimum Weighted Average Mark in the semester following being placed on probation, the probation status will terminate.
3. Students on probation that do not meet the required Weighted Average Mark in the semester following being placed on probation will have their scholarship suspended for the following semester and shall not receive payments during this period.
4. If you meet the required minimum Weighted Average Mark in the semester you are suspended, your scholarship will be reinstated and payments will resume. There shall be no retrospective scholarship payments (offset) will be made for the period of suspension.
5. If you do not meet the required minimum Weighted Average Mark in the semester you are suspended, your scholarship will be terminated and no further payments will be made.

⁴ Weighted Average Mark (WAM) is used each semester to assess your academic performance for your eligibility to receive a scholarship payment. If your semester WAM falls below the minimum required for your particular scholarship, your overall course WAM will be assessed.

6. TAXATION ISSUES

As an enrolled full-time student your scholarship payment will not be taxed. If you are enrolled part-time your scholarship payment will be taxed. You will also need to declare your scholarship as assessable income in your tax return regardless of whether it is paid directly to you or to your tuition fees.

Scholarship payments are exempt from means testing up to the value of the Commonwealth Scholarship payment values. For 2012 this value was \$7131. Scholarship payments more than this value will be assessed as income. Call CentreLink for further information or visit (www.facsia.gov.au/guides_acts/ssg/ssguide). You should keep your offer letter as your scholarship details will be required by Centrelink.

7. SCHOLARSHIP TERMINATION

The IBIBS CSU may terminate your scholarship if you have:

- discontinued from your course or have an 'inactive' enrolment
- failed to meet the eligibility criteria and conditions of your scholarship
- failed to maintain satisfactory academic progress
- been suspended or excluded for misconduct under IBIBS policy

If terminated you will not receive any further scholarship payments. You may be required to repay some or all of your scholarship. You are required to repay your scholarship within 2 weeks of receiving the payment (offset) if:

- the payment is made to you in error or you have been overpaid
- you do not meet the conditions of the scholarship or you are not entitled for the scholarship due to the provision of false or misleading information
- you have been made a scholarship offer in error

8. GRIEVANCES AND APPEALS

8.1 GRIEVANCES

You may lodge complaints about academic and or administrative matters under the IBIBS Grievance Policy and Procedure available via the website (www.ibibs.edu.au/policy)

8.2 APPEALS

9. PRIVACY

The information you provide to IBIBS within your application for an IBIBS scholarship is collected for the primary purpose of assessing your eligibility to receive a scholarship. In the event that you are successful; offering you a scholarship and administering that scholarship. The other purposes of collection include dealing with administrative matters relating to your application, administration of the program, corresponding with you, statistical analysis and to comply with legislative reporting requirements. The information may also be disclosed to relevant government authorities and governance bodies.

You have a right to access personal information that IBIBS holds about you, subject to any exceptions in relevant legislation. 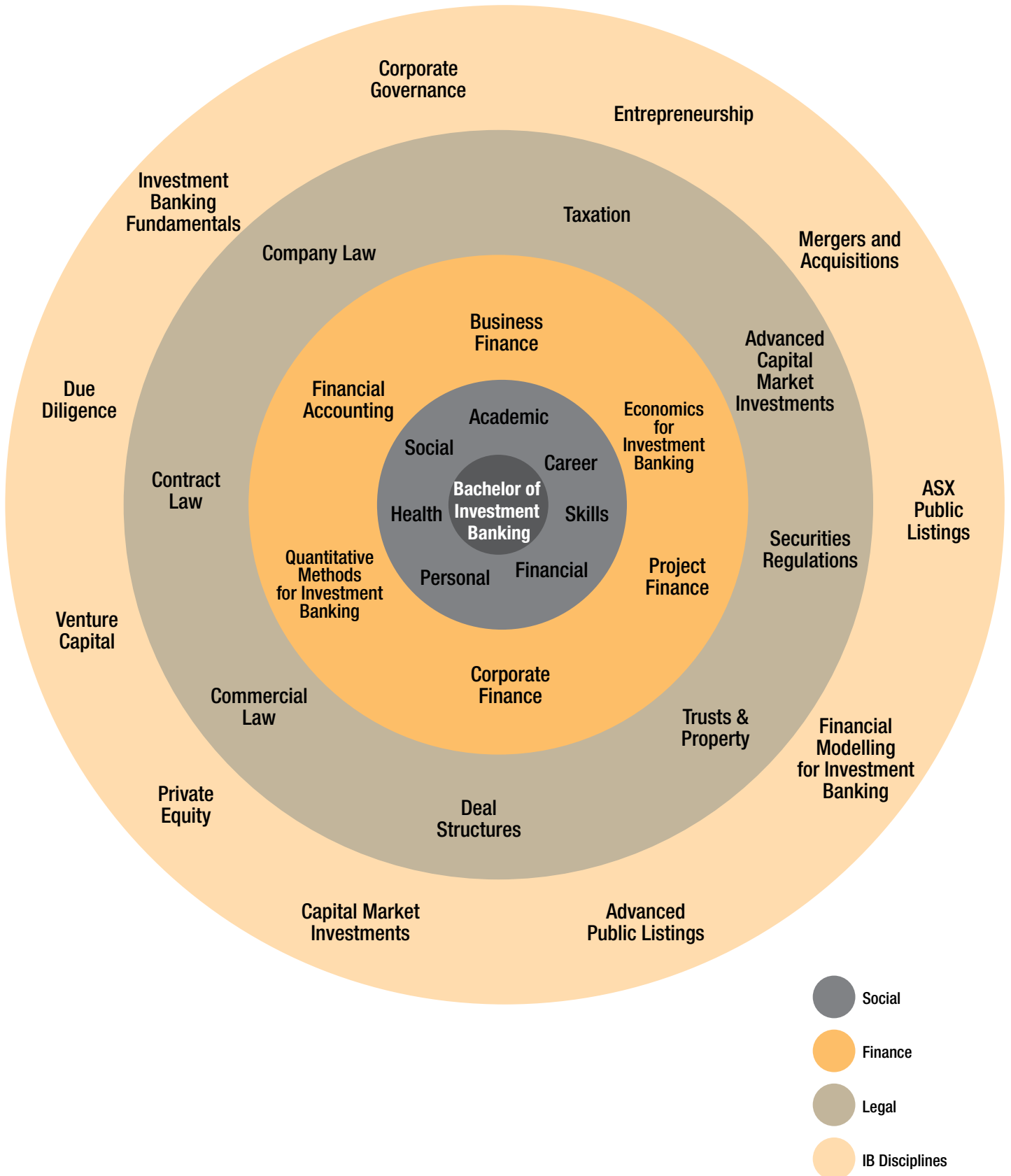
